I have been impressed with the liveliness of activity here at Marvella and high resident involvement. I would like to move here and bring my friends! I would like to share a couple things that have come out of the Marvella Resident Advisory Council and the collaboration with Marvella Management. There was a request for a shredder available and we have decided I will order a large Shred-It box for a couple weeks at the end of April and again for a couple weeks in October. If you need items shredded outside of those time frames, feel free to bring the documents down to the front desk and we can dispose of them in our Shred-It box in the office work area.

The other item of discussion was making a public printer available for resident use. The logistics of this would be difficult to maintain, so it has been decided, after review with the administrative team, that Marvella can print items for free up to 20 pages. After 20 pages we would like residents to seek outside services, such as PostNet and the UPS Store on Ford Parkway. PostNet also offers document shredding services.

statements, but when reviewing with billing, this would not be an easy task and the amounts would be so small.

It was also brought to my attention some signage we are missing to help new residents, families, visitors, EMT's etc, to find their way around our community. I am working on getting those ordered and in place.

Pastor Maia's Message

U.S. poet laureate Ada Limon writes, "The more I am aware of my mortality, the better person I am and the better I am at choosing a life that is aware of its beauty." To me, this is part of the work in the Christian liturgical season of Lent. We become aware of our brokenness in order to lean into beauty.

Lent is the season of the Church in the weeks leading up to Easter. It happens to be one of my favorite seasons- no presents to wrap, no parties, no helter-skelter, no cookies to bake. Instead, it is an opportunity to slow the pace and to deepen spiritual practice. It is time to lean into the prayer: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me." (Psalms 51)

Jesus often retreated to the wilderness or the desert to pray, and in his witness there is an invitation for us. We are invited to come back to our center. There are so many beautiful spiritual practices: lectio divina (reading sacred text meditatively), chanting, praying while walking, or journaling with Jesus. Remember, prayer is that which draws you into communication with the Holy One.

I invite you this Lent to stop me in the hallway and tell me a new way that you will be trying out a spiritual practice in your life this season. Otherwise, drop by my office anytime (door is always open when I am inside! Come on in!), and let me know how you are deepening your spiritual practice this season.

A fter much anticipation, the marketing gates have opened on Marvella, phase 2. Marvella 2190 will offer 125 beautifully appointed senior apartments with upscale finishes and a variety of floorplans. Program plans to bring exceptional musicians to Marvella



f you were at the February 25 concert in the Town Hall, featuring violinist Ariana Kim, you attended the first concert of the Marvelous Performances program.

What is Marvelous Performances? As the name suggests, Marvelous Performances is an event with an exceptional performer or performers who are among the best musicians in their artistic field.

How does it work? A committee of residents has been formed to help with the production of each Marvelous Performance. Joining the resident volunteers in the committee will be staff liaisons Kevin O'Donnell, Director of Life Enrichment and Steve Preus, Presbyterian Homes Foundation Representative. The committee will identify and recruit prospective performers and advise the Presbyterian Homes Foundation on fundraising strategies, generating charitable gifts which pay for each performance.

How is this different from performances handled by Life Enrichment? Life Enrichment will continue to do what it does on a regular basis. However, the budget limits the number of musical performances and the amount paid to each performer. Life Enrichment has brought excellent music to Marvella, which Marvelous Performances aims to complement by offering more music and by booking performers that presently do not fit within a limited budget.

How do you know this is going to work? Like any new venture, it is not known if this will work. However, there are signs that suggest Marvelous Performances will work.

Throughout the ages, patrons of the arts have contributed to special music and arts.

Similar programs have been successfully introduced and maintained at three different sites of Presbyterian

Homes & Services.

Marvella residents have already proven that worthy causes, such as support to employees, Spiritual Life, Life Enrichment, Wellness, and other special needs will be supported by many residents.
